SELECTMEN'S WORKSHOP March 22, 2022

Thomas Seymour brought the meeting to order at 6:30 pm.

Board Business:

Town Warrant - Signed

Waste Management proposed service offering for a five-year contract extension. The town's current contract is set to expire on September 30, 2022. Waste Management is presenting the Town of Hill new rates effective October 1, 2022. The rates include two options 1) Continue with WM trucking trash to Pembroke and packing Win Waste for disposal, 2) WM trucks to their facility and disposes of waste. These rates would be subject to the execution of a New Five-Year Contract. The Board of Selectmen have reviewed the contract from Waste management but would like more information about the Concord Regional Waste Cooperative that we are currently under with (Win-Technologies). Lisa Seymour will reach out to Michael Stanley to come to the Selectmen's meeting on April 5th to further discuss our current status with Concord Regional Waste Cooperative.

Lakes Region Heating & Air Conditioning quote for the mini split replacement was signed. These will be purchased using the ARPA funding received last fall.

The Board of Selectmen discussed the purchase of the 2021 Chevrolet Silverado 6500HD from Key Auto Group located in Newport NH and the additional equipment to be added at HP Fairfield. Thomas Seymour asked why is the vehicle still on the lot if other vehicles are hard to come by? Shaun Bresnahan said it was at Rochester for a long time as a cab & chassis; about 40 days ago it was brought to Newport and a dump bed was installed also he thought it rides rough.

Shaun Bresnahan made a motion to purchase the 2021 Chevrolet Silverado 6500HD for \$77,192.64 from Key Auto Group which includes the trade of the 2012 Ford F550. Francis Razzaboni seconded the motion. All in favor.

Shaun Bresnahan made a motion to accept the HP Fairfield sales quote for \$35,850.00 for the CV style chassis uplift. Thomas Seymour seconded the motion. All in favor.

Lisa Seymour will create a letter to request the funds from the capital reserve in the amount of \$113,042.64 to purchase the new truck as voted on at town meeting.

Lisa Seymour will contact Primex to add the new truck to the insurance policy.

Shaun Bresnahan provided an update on the Borough Road. He said that the Highway crew adding crushed stone down the middle of the road to stabilize it; they have completed to the west end as of today. SKR delivered 4 tractor trailer loads of stone. The highway department will be moving to Currier Road on March 23rd and to repair Dearborn Road from Frost Road to Bootjack. Thomas

Seymour wanted to discuss purchasing of signs to state No Thru Traffic, Pass at Your Own Risk, Road Closed and new 6 Ton Posted signs to be in compliance with the RSA for posted roads. These signs can be purchased at the State of NH Department of Corrections. The signs that we currently have don't include the RSA reference; the weight posting signs are falling apart and difficult read. Kathy Paradise contacted the office and was very concerned that Currier Road was virtually in passable and stated she was very concerned that emergency vehicles might not make it through. Shaun Bresnahan spoke with her and reassured her that the town has a four-wheel rescue truck. Francis Razzaboni mentioned that King Road had some washing at the Needle Shop Brook crossing. Alexandria, Danbury and Salisbury are in far worst shape then Hill.

The School Area Agreement has been located in the Selectmen's office. The Long Term Inter-Governmental Agreement was entered into on the 11th day of June 2002. Another Long Term Inter-Governmental Agreement by and between the Board of Selectmen and the Hill School Board for school use of Maurice P. Wheeler Ballpark was entered the 7th day of June 2011. Lisa Seymour will scan and send this out the Board for review. This will need to be reviewed by the dual boards. The septic system services both the town hall and the school. Shaun Bresnahan asked how often does the septic get serviced? Also, more questions about the generator were raised about who is really responsible for this unit. The school is the emergency shelter in the event of an outage or other events.

April Meeting the board will still meet on the 5th even though the Administrative Assistant will be on vacation. They will meet with Dean Stevenson and Shelly Henry.

Brookside Trailer Park is seeking a demolition permit for the removal of 19 Park Street.

At the April 19th meeting the board will be reviewing the revised building permit and driveway permit process.

The Selectmen will also be sending out letters to residents that haven't installed their culverts on newly constructed driveways.

With no further business to conduct, Francis Razzaboni made the motion to adjourn the meeting Shaun Bresnahan the motion. Motion passed unanimously motion at 7:59 pm.
